

47th Annual Bangor Labor Day Road Race



Best of the Best – New England Top 80

Steeped in History, Bangor has been active in modern road racing starting in 1909 when Olympic Gold Medalist from the 1908 London Games, Johnny Hayes, came to compete in a 15 mile running exhibition. In 1916, the two-time runner up of the 1912 and 1913 Boston Marathon, Andrew Sockalexis, raced 19 miles from his home in Old Town to Bangor against 7 time BAA champion, Clarence DeMar. In 1940, Clarence DeMar would return to win a Labor Day race in Bangor. On Halloween in 1982, Greg Meyer and Joan Benoit Samuelson would win the Benjamin's 10K to repeat their victories at the 1983 Boston Marathon. And for 47 consecutive Labor Days Bangor has witnessed this storied course with its challenging Holland Street Hill, where races have been won and lost. Passing historic houses and fine architecture from Bangor's prominent days as the Lumber Capital of the World, viewing its unique water standpipe, and going by Stephen King's home certainly makes this if not a race, at least a tale to remember.

Start Time 9:00 AM

Race Day Registration is 7:45 am to 8:45 am at the Bangor Park and Recreation Center at 647 Main Street, Bangor. The start and finish are also at the Bangor Park and Recreation Center. This is a 5 mile wheel measured course. USATF # - ME99005WN

Entry Fee is \$15 per participant. Checks made payable to the Sub5 Track Club. The first 100 to register receive a race t-shirt.

The **Robin Emery trophy** is awarded to the top female finisher, and the **Bob Hillgrove trophy** is awarded to the top male finisher. 1st place in each category will receive commemorative medallions, 2nd and 3rd places will receive gift certificates from Epic Sports located in Downtown Bangor. The male and female age divisions are 19 and under, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-69, 70 and over.
